"Jikji - The Missing History of Metal Type Printed Books"



Dr. Eun-Hee Koo, the Honorary Ambassador of Jikji Publicity in U.S., will introduce Jikji, the extant oldest metal printed book in the world, including the history and value of it to make participants be able to promote Jikji actively in U.S. This lecture will include showing the 12 minutes of promotional video of Jikji, discussion of value of Jikji, why it is important to know and to teach Jikji at American schools. She will guide how to search errors and ask correction on the metal printing history on the website, and lead group presentation of the discussion.

The workshop participants would have a chance to reprint the last page of "Jikji" with same way that original Jikji was printed in 1377 as a hands-on activity with Dr. Koo and Dr. Jae K. Wi, a Jikji expert of reprinting.

" Emphasizing the Teaching and Learning of STEAM/
NGSS in a Globalizing World"

Dr. Jennifer Park, Professor, USC

With the increasing number of globalizing countries and the ever-growing science technology engineering and math (STEM) relevant career fields, the implementation of inquiry-based science teaching and learning is crucial. The competitiveness of each country is rising, thus schools in the United States must make a change. In addition, as more careers revolve around STEM, the integration of the NGSS and STEAM (integrating the arts) opens up a new way of learning science through collaborative and innovative explorations of the world. Through the Crosscutting Concept approach, students are given opportunities to understand the world across domains, while simultaneously cultivating their 21st century skills. As the world continues to evolve, it's time that our way of teaching and learning science evolves as well, and the NGSS and STEAM approach steers teachers and students in the right direction.
